Joseph Bacon

Joseph Bacon was born on 24 Sep 1833 and baptized on the 25th at St Elizabeth, in the Dautray Seigneury, Quebec. His parents were Narcisse Bacon and Amable Piette.

In the 1850 Census we find him with his parents, Nelson Bacon and Abigail.

Joseph enlisted on 23 Aug 1862 in Burlington.

On 4 Oct 1862 he was assigned to Company C of the 12th Regiment of VT Volunteers.



He mustered out on 4 Jul 1863 after 9 months and 9 days of service. The 12th thru 16th regiments were only 9 months regiments. The 12th regiment was at Gettysburg but was guarding the wagons and did not see any action.

He married (2nd) Mary A. Papineau (Thomas) (1852 - 1928) on 4 Apr 1885 by a minister in Burlington.

In 1880 he is listed as a Saloon owner at 16-18 Church St in Burlington.

Joseph died on 17 Jul 1889 in Burlington, VT.
